**IS ANOTHER STORY
OF THE TROUBLES AND

S. J. Kilpatrick, Past Chief Councillor Sums Up the Records of the Past Twenty Years.

Kingston, Feb. 24.—(To the Editor): In your issue of Thursday last, February 20th, you published a letter from the pen of Dr. A. W. Now, presuming for the sake of argument, that the above figures mean all they were intended to convey to the susceptible mind, what can our council boast of after twenty years hard work and plodding? Divide the total claimed assets among the 700 members and we would be able to secure the wonderful sum of \$2.04, per capita. If we take out of the total assets the present liabilities of our council, namely, \$443.63, we would only be able to count on \$140 per head in the bank to our credit, of which we can hardly afford to boast, in a city so full of fraternal insurance societies, who might be tempted to "laugh at our calamity, and mock when our fear cometh."

But our chief councillor was so completely overwhelmed with sympathy for the maligned officers of 1907, that he forgot to place in his "authorized" statement the fact that out of the sum of \$882.76 (which is the amount of our assets after the liabilities amounting to \$443.63, has been taken out) we must allow the sum of \$800, for lodge room, furniture, etc., and with this deducted, a ledge with 700 members, and an existence of twenty years, only has to its credit the paltry sum of \$182.76, a showing over which we should throw the mantle of shame, rather than the lime-light of publicity. But this is not all. The furniture, which is given more than its purchased value, would not realize anywhere by private or public sale \$300, and if this is the real value

of it to-day, as it stands in the council room, added to \$182.76 cash on hand, we have the sum of \$482.76, from which we must deduct the present liabilities, \$443.63, and we have a grand balance to "divide" with 700 members, or rather the 600 faithful ones, who have not yet forsaken the ship. No. 20, C.O.C.F., of Kingston, of course, even this showing is based on presumption that the furniture in the council room is an actual asset, and to be an actual asset, it must be shown that it was purchased by the council, and paid for out of the council treasury, in the usual way. If it was bought by money loaned by members, who expect its return, this \$800 item must be taken from the council's assets, and then what have we to face? \$182 each on hand, with liabilities of \$443.63, which would leave us \$260 in debt, and without any visible means of paying off this sum.

Put there, why bother with facts and figures which must necessarily produce "strife and discord?" Let us have "peace and harmony," regardless of the cost. Under the direction of our new and capable chief councillor, No. 20, may go on to better and bigger things, and at the close of the year 1908, I believe we shall be able to look upon a clean lot of officers, a clean set of books, and a clean treasury, without a dollar to its credit anywhere. Let all the kickers go out, we can get a new lot in, who don't know so much, and whom we can handle to better advantage, and if they too grow wise, "no effort will be made by the officers of No. 20, to retain the membership of any who wish to withdraw."
