DUTIES—A settler is required to perform the duties under one of the follow-

(1) At least six months' residence up pn and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(3) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the lather is deceased) of a homesteader has bermanent residence on farming land hand solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, and homesteader was perform his care. such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the fath-br (or mother.)

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as mean-ing not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself mus notify the Agent for the district of such intention. Before making application for patent the sattler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his inten-

COAL-Coal mining rights may be seased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. At royalty at the rate of five cents per ton all be collected on the merchantable cent thed QUARTZ—A person eighteen years .4 age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.
At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may apon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of Railways and Canals, Canada.
