

Synopsis of Canadian North West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 2 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homesteaded entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency under certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agent's office may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim or if entry has been granted it will be summarily cancelled.

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homesteaded entry, and only one application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to distribution of cancellation proceeds the applicant for cancellation will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for cancellation must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister if eligible, but to no one else, on filing Declaration of abandonment.

DUTIES—A settler is required to perform the duties under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of the year.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of any allowance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties by living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Before making application for patent the settler must give an affidavit in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of two to six years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,000 acres may be leased to one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal.

QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. As least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended on the claim, the locator may upon having a survey made, and complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent on the sales. Placer mining claims are generally 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

A SQUARE HIP-ROOF HOUSE,

Designed by Charles S. Sedgwick, Arch., Minneapolis, Minn.



The size of this house, exclusive of piazza, is 28 by 30 feet, the main piazza across the front is 8 feet in width, the first story is nine feet in height and the second story 8 feet.

The outside of the house is sided with narrow clapboards up to the second-story windows. At this point a narrow moulded cornice extends around the house and the upper portion of the house and roof shingled.

The square house becomes more popular every day, the greatest amount of space being attained at the smallest expense. The plan of this house is carefully worked out.

Entering through a small vestibule into a reception hall or music-vestibule with the main stairs leading up opposite the entrance. At the left side of this hall is a projected window affording a beautiful space for a piano or seat.

The living-room on the right is 15 by 18 feet, lighted with a large triple window on the piazza and a small bay window at the side.

The one chimney is centrally located affording a fire-place in the living-room and convenient access from the kitchen; also a furnace flue. The cellar stairs lead down under the main stairs with an outside garage entrance.

A small passageway from the front hall to kitchen under the main stairs affords space for lavatory and for hanging of coats and hats. At the rear of the kitchen is an open porch, partly enclosing a space for refrigerator. There are two doors between kitchen and dining-room with passage-way through the pantry.

The dining-room is attractive and convenient in space, with a wide projected Dutch window opposite the sliding doors and a recessed sideboard at the end of room, with small window lighting over. The finish of this first story is in quartered oak, with oak floors.

The second floor of this house is six feet less in depth than the first story, being twenty-eight feet wide by twenty-four feet in depth. There are four nice chambers, reached directly from the central hall, provided with good closets, well lighted, with windows on two sides in each room and a good bathroom, also a convenient stairway leading to the attic story, in which there is ample storage space, lighted with a dormer window on three sides. There is also available space for finishing servants' rooms, if desired. The finish of the woodwork in the chambers is in white enamel, and the floors

of birch. The walls throughout plastered with sand finish and neatly tinted, with smooth troweled finish four feet high in the kitchen, vestibule and bathroom, and laid off in small tile. The outside of the house is painted white in the first story and the shingles on the upper portion of the roof stained dark green, and sash painted white, this gives a very pretty effect to the exterior, especially so where the sash are divided into small lights with wood divisions. The cost of this house should not exceed \$3,500 in any locality, exclusive of heating and plumbing. There is a good basement under the entire house, and the space not being large, the heating plant and the plumbing altogether would not exceed \$500.


