HUMAN REMAINS FOUND ON THE EXPRESS REACHING TORONTO. Thought to Be Those of Frederick Chin of Maple-Likely That Grant Will Be Made. Toronto, March 4.—The human remains, sticking between the baggage and mail car of the North Bay express, which arrived in Toronto, last night, are believed to be those of Frederick Chin, a laborer, who lived near Maple. According to information received, the agent at Maple, last evening, refused Chin's request for a ticket to King, whereupon Chin started to walk to King along the railway tracks. Great banks of snow were piled on either side of the track, and it is thought that Chin was unable to get out of the way of the express, and consequently was run down and cut to pieces. Chin was about fifty years old, and without relatives in Canada.

A deputation representing the Canadian Olympic committee, waited upon Hon. Mr. Matheson, provincial treasurer, this morning, asking for a grant of \$5,000 towards the fund to send amateur athletes to the Olympic games in England this year. It was pointed out that the dominion had already promised \$15,000, but since the most competing athletes would come from Ontario, it was advisable for this province to contribute something. The provincial treasurer seemed favorably disposed towards the proposition.

Upon a charge of bigamy Charles Wilson appeared before the police magistrate this morning. In 1902 under the name of Robinson, Wilson married a girl named Minna, who afterwards left him and went to Cleveland. Wilson in 1906 married Lena Ashton and the couple have been living at 141 Dovercourt Road. The second wife, becoming suspicious, went to the police with the result that Wilson was arrested. The man has children by both wives. The case was remanded for a week.

The Ontario executive of the Dominion Trades Congress waited upon the members of the cabinet, this morning, and asked that the government bring forward legislation to provide for centre aisles in open street cars, and air brakes on all cars. It was urged also that the government appoint a special officer to see that the fair wage clause in public contracts was carried out. The deputation said further that the payment of bonuses to immigration agents should cease. Premier Whitney said the suggestions would receive every consideration.
