DUTIES-A settler is required to per-(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years,

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of him homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has bermanent residence on farming land bwned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres is extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity of the homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother.)
