Demanding Acknowledgment of His Innocence.

Paris, March 13.—President Fallieres is doing some hard thinking because of a letter he received a few days ago from M. Jules Danval, who begs to be sent to the French penal colony in New Caledonia, where he, although innocent of any crime, has spent twenty-five years of his life.
