DEATH OF B. A. WARTMAN

AN AGED RESIDENT PASSED AWAY.

Born in Kingston in 1824—Lived Near Collins Bay For Seventy-Eight Years—His Wife Died Only Two Months Ago.

On Tuesday afternoon, about half past three o'clock, there passed to rest an aged and honored citizen in the person of Barnabas Anderson Wartman, who breathed his last in the home of his daughter, Mrs. James Craig, Princess street, just as the funeral of the late Alderman John Gaspin was passing by.

Mr. Wartman was a very scientific farmer, and he kept his lands in such condition that he acquired prominence as an agriculturalist.

Only two months ago his wife passed away. She was Catherine McArthur, of the township of Pittsburgh. Her remains are in Cataract vault, and thus the remains of the worthy couple will lie side by side in the family plot at the same time, a fitting termination of long and happy lives.

Three years ago Mr. Wartman came to Kingston to live with his daughter, Mrs. Craig, who, with two other sisters, Mrs. E. J. Adams and Miss Ida Wartman, survive. One sister of the deceased is living, viz., Mrs. Charles Shibley, of Portland township.

The deceased grand old man had seen many history-making epochs and incidents of national and civic importance. He was a type of man that has been exceedingly rare in Canada.

His happy disposition and courteous manner made many friends for him, particularly among the young. His demise is deeply regretted for its passing away removes a character that was prominently associated with the growth and prosperity of Frontenac during the past sixty years.

For the lapses which some men plead in extenuation of their failures he had no patience and no respect. In his breast there were no emotions save those which belokened the high-minded citizen and truth-loving gentleman.

The friends of his youth have since preceded him to the great beyond, but on the younger generations, who knew him, he left a deep impression. A good life is always a meditation to the race, and Mr. Wartman's will be cherished because of its purity and worth.
