ENGLISH IMMIGRANTS HUG TO TORONTO.

Two Hundred Arrived Here This Morning—More Are Coming—Lacrosse Matches Arranged.

Toronto, March 30.—Two hundred immigrants came from the old country, on a C.P.R. special, this morning.

Manager Charles Quirrie, of the Tecumseh, and Secretary-Treasurer Lanny, of the Shamrock Amateur Athletic Association, met here, on Saturday, and arranged two exhibition lacrosse matches.

It is understood that the provincial government will guarantee the bond of the Canadian Northern railway from Sudbury to Moose Mountain.
