OPENING DISPLAY OF NEW TAILORING MODELS.

What is Correct in Men's Wear For the Spring and Summer of 1908?—How Men Should Dress.

Held That the By-Law Was Legally Carried.

Re Joyce and Township of Pittsburg—Judgment (H.) on application by Luke Joyce to quash a local option by-law of the township. It was conceded on the argument that if the poll clerks and deputy returning officers had no right to vote, there was not a three-fifths majority of votes in favor of the by-law when submitted to the electors for approval.

It was further objected that the deputy returning officers and poll clerks were not entitled to vote because they could not properly take the oath which may be required of a person claiming to vote, because they receive pay for their services.

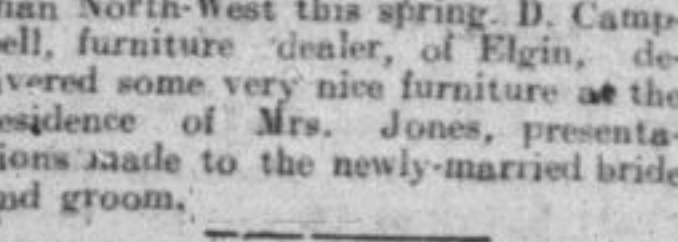

The American Tobacco company has issued a denial that it is in negotiation with the American Society of Equity, an organization of tobacco growers, in Kentucky, relative to the purchase of the tobacco crops of 1906 and 1907. It has been reported that negotiations had been completed for the purchase of these two crops.
