GUILTY OF FORGERY

AN ENGLISHMAN IN TROUBLE AT HAMILTON.

Heavy Winds Did Great Damage at Burlington Beach—Foundations of Cottages Almost Washed Away.

Hamilton, April 2.—"Andy" Ferguson, a young Englishman, pleaded guilty at the police court, this morning, to committing forgery. He boarded with Jennie McMichael, and to square her account gave the woman a check for \$25, forging the name of Donald Fraser. Ferguson also forged the name of George Elliott to a check for \$10, and unsuccessfully tried to enter the check at several stores. When he was arrested, another forged check and some bank cheques were found on him. He was remanded until to-morrow for sentence.

The high winds, yesterday, so stirred up old Lake Ontario that considerable damage was done at Burlington Beach. Verandas were destroyed by the force, the foundations of some of the cottages were almost washed away and the lake shore pavilion of the Hotel Brant was wrecked. There was a danger of some of the steel towers of the transmission line of the Electrical Development Company being undermined at the north side of the piers, but the company reports that the steel structure withstood the strain. Henry Lalonde, Donald Smith and F. Cumming, late of the Corwalls, have been engaged by the Hamilton lacrosse club. The announcement was made this morning. Lalonde is to be playing manager of the team. These three stars will materially strengthen the local team.

AN EARLY ELECTION.

The Provincial Battle on Next Month. Toronto, Ont., April 2.—If information obtained from conservative sources is reliable, the prediction of Hon. A. G. MacKay to the effect that the provincial election will be held on May 28th will be found nearly correct. Two conservative candidates stated, yesterday, that they understood that May 28th would be about the date. This early election, of course, is in accord with the premier's declaration, yesterday, to dissolve the house early next week. It seems that every portion of business will be rushed to go to the country at the earliest possible moment.

SAFE BLOWN OPEN

And Everything in it Was Carried Off. Blythe, Ont., April 2.—Last night, between twelve and two o'clock, James McMurtrie's private bank was broken into and the safe blown to pieces and everything taken. The burglars gained entrance by forcing the front door with a crow-bar, and used dynamite on the safe. Two coast-guard men, strangers, fairly well-dressed, who slept in a farmer's barn, about two miles from here, the previous night, are supposed to be the guilty parties. The amount of the loss is not known.

In Favor of Plaintiffs.

Sandwich, Ont., April 2.—Judge Hodgins, of the admiralty court, gave a decision in favor of the plaintiffs in the suit of the Dunbar and Sullivan Dredging Company, who are working on the channel improvements, at Amherstburg, against the steamer Milwaukee, for \$3,000 damages. The Milwaukee became entangled in an old anchor chain picked up on the bottom. One of the dredging company's screws was called to the rescue, and while working on the tangle was run down by the Milwaukee.

Is a Great Flood.

Elkhorn, W. Va., April 2.—Excepting the cloud burst of seven years ago, when one hundred lives were lost, the greatest flood ever known in the Tug River and Elkhorn valleys now prevails. Hundreds of families are camping along the mountain side, their homes being inundated. Three men were drowned by the collapse of a suspension bridge spanning the Blue-stone river. Three lives are reported lost at North Fork and two at Key-stones.

Calling For Tenders.

Montreal, April 2.—F. W. Morse, manager of the Grand Trunk Pacific, who has returned from a trip of inspection in the west, announces that the company has called for tenders for the construction of 129 miles of the road west of the most westerly section, contracted for which will carry the line to Yellow Head pass into the Rocky Mountain district.

Died Under Anaesthetic.

London, Ont., April 2.—Thomas Coley, who was struck by a yard engine in the C.P.R. yards, succumbed to his injuries, yesterday, as the victim of an anaesthetic for amputation of a partly-severed leg, but owing to loss of blood failed to revive.

ACQUIT MINISTER.

Chancellor Day Dismissed By Bishop Amid Cheers. New York, April 2.—The charges preferred against Chancellor Day, of Syracuse University, by Rev. George A. Cooke, Brandon, Vt., were ruled out of court by Bishop David H. Moore at the opening of the 109th New York Methodist Episcopal conference, yesterday. Bishop Moore, in dismissing the charges, said he regarded the complaint against Chancellor Day as a direct attack upon free speech and free press. The decision was greeted by cheers and applause.

THE KAISER'S PURSE.

Proposed Increase of Civil List to \$3,930,000 a Year. Berlin, April 2.—An authentic report is in circulation here that a bill soon will be introduced in the Prussian diet raising the civil list of the emperor. This list now amounts to \$3,930,000 a year, which sum is paid the emperor as king of Prussia, and not as emperor of Germany; the latter position carries no salary. The explanation offered for raising the list is the increased cost of living which bears particularly heavily in the royal household because of the large number of children and other persons dependent upon the purse of the monarch.

New York, April 2.—Application has been made to the supreme court, by Mrs. John E. Sankey, wife of the oldest son of Mrs. D. Sankey, for her appointment as a committee for her husband, who is in an asylum in Astoria. Sankey's father, age well on in the seventies, is a helpless invalid in his home in Brooklyn.
