SHIPPING IN WHISKEY TO DETROIT PENDING SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTE.

Hiram Walker & Son, Canadian Distillers, Are Active—Judge Orders Two Promoters to Pay Money Into Court.

Detroit, Mich., April 6.—Judge Kinne, of the circuit court at Ann Arbor, Mich., has ordered G. H. Purchase and E. C. Glenn, Detroit promoters, to pay into that court seven thousand dollars of the twelve thousand five thousand dollars collected from Ann Arbor investors in a prospective oil well in the Tilbury, Ont., oil fields in 1906. Judge Kinne said the evidence showed that Purchase and Glenn represented to their clients that ten thousand five hundred dollars would be required to secure the lease, and that it was incontrovertible that they knew that the lease was to cost only two thousand five hundred, and it was doubtful if even that much was paid for it. Two thousand more was spent in development when the subscribers became disgusted and had the property placed in the hands of a receiver. The seven thousand dollars will be paid the investors.

Pending the settlement of the dispute between the United States government and Hiram Walker & Son, Walkerville distillers, as to the wording of the labels on cases of whiskey brought across the river for importation, more whiskey is being brought in. The steamer Garland was chartered on Saturday and brought 6,500 cases from Walkerville to Detroit, where it was placed in the bonded warehouse.

The answer of the opposition was made by E. J. B. Pense, the member for Kingston, who made it apparent at once that he could at least be heard in the galleries, and as a consequence the audience gave him their attention. The manner in which he proved that, although only three years in office, the conservatives had increased the public expenditure by about the same amount as had the liberals in their thirty-two years of power was most convincing. His arraignment of the government for having over \$36,000 for legal services up against \$7,000 in 1904 will doubtless have much effect with the farmers. We must also his denunciation of the expenditure of over \$16,000 for the entertainment of visitors when compared with the \$150 expended for entertainment by the Ross government.

Capt. Henry Daryean has left with his crew for Picton to fit out the schooner Jamieson. Capt. Daryean sailed on the schooner Lizzie Metzner last year.

The engineers on the tug of the M. T. company have arrived to put the tugs in shape for the season's work.

The wheat left in the steamer Ames, last fall, is being unloaded at Richardson's elevator to-day. It is expected that the vessel will make a trip to the upper lakes in a few days.

Capt. McIntyre, of the steamer Ames, arrived in the city to-day from Owen Sound.

The steamer Rosedale may clear tomorrow for Oswego to load coal for Toronto. If not to-morrow the vessel will leave as soon as possible. Capt. Baxter has arrived and is getting his crew together.

Engineer Brennan, of the government dredge Sir Richard, has arrived here from Kingsville, and the steward, Frederick Sparks, has also reported for duty.
