Between Hydro-Electric Commis-

sion and Ontario Power Co. Toronto, Ont., April 10 .- The contract between the Hydro-Electric Commission, and the Ontario Power comcorporated by the bill presented to the legislature by Hon, Adam Beck, of Everything Easily Read The commission promises to take power exclusively up to 30,000 horse-power, and also, in addition thereto, onehalf of the amount of power required by the commission up to 10,000 horsepower; thereafter the commission may, at its option, take power from other sources. The commission agrees to pay the company at the rate of 89.40 per horse-power per annum, for power at 12,000 volts, and at the rate of \$10.40 per horse-power, per annum for power at 60,000 volts, and when the amount reserved and held ted suicide, by inhaling illuminating commission is in all 25,000 horse-powready for delivery at the order of the er or more, payment shall be made at the rate of \$9 per horse-power, per annum for power at 60,000 volts.
