

OMESTEAD REGULATIONS. ny even numbered section of Dominon Lands in Manitoba or the North-West erved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or main over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-guarter section, of 150 acres, more Application for homestead entry must

be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, he made at an Agency on certain conditions by
the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agent's office, may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim or if entry has been granted it will be

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be ligible for homestead entry, and only one cation for cancellation will be refrom an individual until that apation has been disposed of. Where an entry is cancelled subsequent o institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be en-Applicant for cancellation must state in what particulars the homesteader is in

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. if eligible, but to no one else, on peclaration of abandonment. DUTIES-A settler is required to
