

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Previnces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Domission Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or cancella-tion made personally at any sub-agent's office may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applion receipt of the telegram such applicato held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by

In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim or if entry has been granted it will be ummarily cancelled.

An application for cancellation must be rade in person. The applicant must be ligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be reeived from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be en-titled to prior right of entry.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father mother, son, daughter, brother or mater if eligible, but to no one else, on filing echaration of abandomnent. DUTIES-A settler is required to per-form the duties under one of the follow-

ing plans :(I) At least six months' residence upyear during the term of three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will most meet this requirement.

(5) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned, solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, uch homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the ather (or mother.)

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two recoding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line exclusive of the width of road alwance crossed in the measurement.
(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or a farming land owned by himself must otify the Agent for the district of such

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2; per cent on the sales.
