REVOLTING CRUELTY.

A Smith's Falls Farmer Let His Cattle to Starve.
 An Elmsley township farmer, living three miles from Smith's Falls, has been guilty of a most revolting piece of cruelty. He and his sister left, last week, for Dakota, without warning. The mortgagees of his property, cattle and goods visited the place, a few days ago, and their visit disclosed one of the most revolting stories of man's inhumanity to dumb animals. Every animal lay dead of starvation.
 In one stable were found six cows lying dead, five more cows and two heifers on the barn floor, two horses in another place, and the colt and the pig in another. The bodies were little more than skeletons and their protruding bones and associated forms told the story of the slow starvation that had come to them. Six of the cows were lying fastened in the bales, the colt had climbed into the granary, evidently in quest of something to eat, but of food for any kind of stock there was not a particle to be found about the place.
