

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West A'rovinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male sover 18 years of age, to the extent of sons-marter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Domission Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Matry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agent's office may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by soail.

In case of "personation" or fraud the implicant will forfest all priority of claim por if entry has been granted it will be ummanily cancelled. An application for cancellation must be ade in person. The applicant must be

ligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of. Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be en-titled to prior right of entry.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father mother, son, daughter, brother or sister if eligible, but to no one else, on filing eclaration of abandonment.

DUTIES—A settler is required to perform the duties under one of the following plane.

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solety by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will

not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned, selely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for law him. stead entered for by him in the vicinity, uch homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the ather (or mother.)

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two recuding paragraphs is defined as mean-

ing not more than nine miles in a direct line exclusive of the width of road alwance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or a farming land owned by himself must ofify the Agent for the district of such


