

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominfon Lands in Manitoba or the North-West
Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male
pver 18 years of age, to the extent of
one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more
pr less.

Application for homestead entry must Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, he made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agent's pince may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such applicaon receipt of the telegram such applica-tion is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim pr if entry has been granted it will be ammanily cancelled.

An application for cancellation must be ligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicant for cancellation must state in hat particulars the homesteader is in slefault.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father mother, son, daughter, brother or sister if eligible, but to no one else, on filing sclaration of abandonment.

DUTIES—A settler is required to perform the duties under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence uping the term of three years, homesteader may, if he so deires, perform the required residence luties by living on farming land owned lolely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his nomestead. Joint ownership in land will

not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land towned, selely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, uch homesteader may perform him own

stend entered for by him in the vicinity, uch homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the ather (or mother.)

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two receding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line exclusive of the width of road alwance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or a farming land owned by himself must offy the Agent for the district of such tention.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 24 per cent on the sales.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

An applicant may obtain two leases to irredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the In-

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rented \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of 24 per cent collected on the output after it ex-
