WILL NOT WITHDRAW

Name of Governor Hughes From the U.S. Presidential Contest.

Governor is Not Seeking Presidential Honor, Says Gen. Woodford, But Will Take It If It is Offered Him.

New York, May 2.--The name of Governor Charles E. Hughes will not be withdrawn from the presidential canvass until the national republican convention at Chicago has made its choice of candidates. This statement was made, to-day, by Gen. Stewart L. Woodford, president of the League of the United States, who presided at a conference of delegates elected to the national convention from New York state, to-day, called in the interest of Governor Hughes.

Bremen, May 2.--The North German Lloyd steamer Koeln, which left here yesterday for Baltimore and Galveston, was in collision in a thick fog, last evening, with the Hamburg tank steamer Emperor Nicholas II, nine miles off Norderney. The Emperor Nicholas II struck the Koeln amidships. The steamship Fieldmarschall, a German East African liner, responded to signals and took off 320 passengers from the Koeln. One child was drowned during the transfer. The Fieldmarschall took the Koeln in tow, and brought her in to Bremerhaven, arriving this morning.
