SOCIALISM SPELLS

DEFEAT FOR WHITNEY IN ONTARIO, HE SAYS.

Senator Casgrain Quotes Leading Conservative Organ As Authority That the Whitney Policies Are Socialistic.

Montreal Herald. Asked by the Herald as to the truth of the statement that he had been invited to address a few meetings in Ontario Senator J. P. Casgrain said: "Yes, I was asked some time ago..."

"Have you any special interests in Ontario?" the senator was asked. "Yes, for a number of years I have been vice-president of Cook & Bros. Lumber company of Toronto, Ontario..."

"Pointing to a morning paper which he had before him, and turning to the editorial entitled 'Ontario's Situation,' Senator Casgrain said: 'I want no better foundation on which to base my political arguments while in Ontario. It is another case of repeating what Voltaire said, 'Save me from my friends; I will look after my enemies.' A more glaring example against Hon. Mr. Whitney's government could not have been written by its worst enemies, and coming as it does from the leading conservative organ in the province of Quebec, it should have a notable effect on the sound thinking men who stood by Mr. Whitney for a long political generation..."

"Why, the Gazette has it in black and white that the policy of Mr. Whitney is a step towards socialism, and it adds that few conservatives will be enthusiastic over it..."

"Hon. Mr. Whitney has acted like a bull in a china shop as far as the financial interests of Ontario are concerned, and if I had no invitation to go to Ontario to help in the coming elections I would deem it my duty to see that a government which has recklessly wrecked the credit of Ontario and of the rest of the provinces of the Dominion should not be entrusted with the administration of the affairs of Ontario for another term. If Ontario is not to protect British and foreign capital invested in this country, where is her future?"

"Have you been conferring with any of the captains of industry in Ontario in regard to this matter?" "Yes, and some of the principal ones, conservatives as they are, strongly deprecate the tendency towards socialism shown by the Whitney administration. I could mention the names of the greatest financiers in Ontario who are absolutely opposed to Mr. Whitney and who will prove this with their ballots in the coming elections..."

"Do you mean to say that Hon. Mr. Whitney and his colleagues are interfering with your rights?" Senator Casgrain was asked. "Precisely. Large companies have been formed to develop water power in Ontario. Naturally they have risked their money and, more particularly, that of their bondholders in new enterprises the success of which is problematical. They were prepared to meet opposition from other private companies similarly situated but not from municipalities which can make by-laws and freeze out private enterprise. Much less are they able to compete with the government of the province itself which has unlimited credit, thanks to the wise policy of the Mowat government for thirty-two years..."

"Well then that must be the reason why nearly all the securities which have been offered by Ontario, on the London market, sold at a large discount?" "Yes, if you follow the financial papers in England you will see it is now impossible to float bonds for private enterprises in Ontario with anything like success..."

"Do you think the Whitney government has a strong hold in Ontario?" "You must remember that the Whitney government has been put in power by the liberals as much as the conservatives. If it had not been for the liberal who voted for Whitney in the last elections he would not have been elected..."

"Was he roughly handled?" "Under the auspices of Whatsoever Circle, King's Daughters, in Aid of Simpson Ward, General Hospital."

As the result of an encounter he had with three men in "Skidoo" Park, on Saturday night, John Filiz, a young man living on William street, is confined to his home, suffering from severe injuries. It is claimed that Filiz was engaged in a altercation with another young man, when two friends of his opponent took a hand in the affair. Filiz was kicked in the face, and badly beaten, and was found lying in the park in an unconscious condition. He is now under the care of Dr. Bell, and the latter informed the Whig, that Filiz had received very severe treatment. It was stated, to-day, that the case would probably be brought before the court. Filiz's injuries will confine him to the house for several days.
