Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, he made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry.

DUTIES .- (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term (2) A homesteader may, if he so

sires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of homestead. Joint ownership in land will

not meet this requirement. (3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader bat permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or

cant. Royalty, five cents per ton. QUARTZ .-- A person eighteen years of may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500.00 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00. DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10.00 a mile per annum. Royalty. 24 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.



MINING LAWS PERMIT FRAUD AND GRAFT.

The Whitney Government Refuse Disturbed.

The following from a recent address of John McKay, liberal candidate in

The Whitney government invited the explorers and citizens interested mining to attend a convention at Toronto, in December, 1905, at their own expense.

The convention unanimously passed resolutions that no lands should at any time or under any circumstances be withdrawn from exploration or sale by order-in-council or otherwise, and that the number of claims that could be staked out by one explorer should

The convention was strongly opposed to inspection of discoveries and to royalty. They urged the establishment of lo-

cal mining recording offices and the erection of a government refinery. The government established local recording offices and appointed party supporters at good salaries, and collected from the explorers and others in 1907 \$273,000 for licenses and re-

cording fees. They imposed a large annual tax on mining companies and levied a royalty on the profits of the mines. law permits a few speculators in Toronto to send up one so-called exstake out thirty claims in the different promising camps.


