HOWARD W. REYNOLDS  
STANDARD BEARER FOR  
COUNTY LIBERALS,Was Selected By Unanimous Vote  
at Convention Held Saturday  
Afternoon.Howard W. Reynolds, of Verona, will be the standard-bearer of the liberal party of the county of Frontenac at the coming provincial election. He was chosen by a unanimous vote, at a convention held in the Whig-hall, on Saturday afternoon.The president, R. J. Vair, occupied the chair, and in opening, explained that the meeting had been called to see what action should be taken regarding the placing of a candidate in the field. He then asked for the general feeling of the meeting, and the reports from the different delegations showed that it was desired to put up a candidate, and on motion of Messrs. S. Snooks and S. Storm, Mr. Reynolds was selected, amidst loud applause.Mr. Reynolds urged the workers to get together and have a strong organization. He could not win out without the united support of all the members of the party. The time before the election was now very short, but if everyone put his shoulder to the wheel there would be no doubt as to the outcome. He had been asked by a unanimous vote to lead the party, and would do so.J. M. Mowat said that in selecting Mr. Reynolds, the convention had secured the best candidate available, and he strongly urged the members to rally around the leader, and send him to victory. With proper support and organization, Mr. Reynolds would be sure to win out. Mr. Reynolds was a good politician, and when elected would not only do credit to the county of Frontenac, but to the whole of Ontario as well. In closing, the speaker referred to the brief time between now and election day, and his farewell message was, that the liberals work hard from now until the end.President Vair, before closing the meeting, also paid tribute to the candidate, referring to his fine record in the township and county councils, in which he served. The meeting closed with cheers for the candidate.
