FITH OF THE NEWS.

The Very Latest Cullied From All Over the World. Near Admiral Crossfield died at the Episcopal hospital on Wednesday morning.

Mr. Jamieson, a Vancouver tailor, had his skull fractured while flying out of a street car window by a blow from a passing car.

Mrs. Henrietta Griesman pleaded guilty at Toronto yesterday to a charge of stealing a \$9 table cloth from Eaton's. Remanded for sentence till Saturday.

Rev. Charles A. Washington, colored bishop of the British Methodist Episcopal church of Canada, died at Woodstock, on Thursday night, aged sixty-one years.

Maurice Powers was instantly killed at Roseland, B.C., while loading some holes in a slope in the eleventh level of the Centre Star mine with a new powder called Mithrilite.

Four persons were killed and a number badly injured by a tornado which struck Alva, Oklahoma, on Wednesday. Half a dozen farm houses were destroyed and the crops for an area of several miles were ruined.

Thomas Kirkpatrick and Emma Hayes were in Toronto police court, accused of bigamy. Kirkpatrick said his first wife, with whom he had not lived for twelve years, was married again. He was remanded. Emma Hayes surprised the court by declaring she was not married to Kirkpatrick. She will produce evidence.

Eighteen lives lost As the Result of a Collision on Yarmouth, N.S., May 27.—As a result of a collision, last night, of Yarmouth, N.S., between the Dominion Atlantic railway steamer Boston and a fishing schooner Fame, of Gloucester, Mass., the schooner sank and of twenty souls on board two were saved and eighteen lost.

Openly Called For Dissolution of House. Ottawa, May 27.—During the disorderly debate in parliament during the night Mr. Taylor, chief conservative whip, openly called upon the government for dissolution and invited the premier to that connection.
