
Sporting Notes.

GANANOQUE TRAGEDY
 AN EIGHT YEAR OLD LAD DROWNED.
 The Body Recovered After Ten Hours Search—Mitchell & Wilson Appeal Judgment For Damages For Death of Miss Pennock.
 Gananoque, May 27.—A very sad fatality occurred a little before noon, yesterday, whereby Reginald, the eight-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Brennan, North street, lost his life. The little fellow was a pupil in Miss Lloyd's room in Stone street school and one of a family of twelve children. His mother, on going to call him to get ready for school, found him sound asleep, and did not wake him. He woke up about ten o'clock and with some of the neighbor's children went to play by the bank of Gananoque river, on a rocky point, along the crescent-shaped bay, known as the Punch bowl, and just a short distance from Stone street, not more than 100 yards north of the school. They played there some little time, and Reggie slipped off the rocky point, but a little neighbor boy grabbed him while he was in the water, but could not hold on. The cries of the children attracted William Griffin, who ran from the street and seeing the boy by that time drifting out, near the centre of the stream, plunged into the water, but when about half way from the shore to the boy, the little fellow sank and Griffin being encumbered by his shoes and clothes had to make for shore. A crowd soon gathered. Boats and grappling irons were secured and all afternoon and evening he riveted and punch bowl were dragged, but to no avail. Richard Wilson was also out in his boat and exploded a dozen or more charges of dynamite, but all to no avail. At half the grappling was still going on. The river bank during the afternoon and evening. There is an under current which circles through the punch bowl, making it very deceptive. The body was found at 9:20 o'clock.
 Mitchell & Wilson, against whom a judgment for \$300 is held by Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Pennock for the death of their daughter, Miss Lucy M. Pennock, have appealed the case, and it will come up for hearing at Toronto in September.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.
 A NY one-hundred section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 3 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.
 Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.
 An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry.
 DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
 (2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.
 (3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).
 (4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line.
SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.
COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.
QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$100.00 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.
PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00.
DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 30 years. Rental, \$10.00 a mile for annum. Royalty, 25¢ per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
