THERE IS NO GROUND

FOR CHARGE MADE AGAINST ST LAURIER

That He Was Discourteous to Borden—He Entered Into No Negotiations With Premier Roblin of Manitoba.

Ottawa, May 29.—With regard to a statement published yesterday, as the conservative view of the negotiations recently conducted between Sir Wilfrid Laurier and R. L. Borden, in regard to the contentious clauses of the election bill, it is claimed by liberals that there is absolutely no ground for the charge of indecisiveness or discourtesy on the part of the prime minister. The conservative view of the matter is based on the allegation of certain negotiations between Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Premier Roblin, of Manitoba, in regard to the Manitoba voters' lists. It is denied on the part of the liberals that Sir Wilfrid ever entered into any such negotiations with Mr. Roblin, and in fact the interview which the Manitoba premier had with Sir Wilfrid Laurier on the 19th was arranged not for this question at all, but for the discussion of the proposed legislation relative to the extension of the boundaries of Manitoba.

As regards the allegation that Sir Wilfrid has failed to provide Mr. Borden with the amendments which he is willing to make to the form of clause 1 of the bill, it is stated that, following Sir Wilfrid's speech in the house, a memorandum was sent to Mr. Borden which removed any doubt as to what the premier's compromise offer meant. This was done before the prime minister ever saw Mr. Roblin.
