MISSIONARY FOLKS ATTEND AT SYDENHAM ST. CHURCH, TUESDAY.

A Large Number of Delegates Are in Attendance—Statement Presented by Treasurer.

With a very large attendance, the twenty-fifth annual meeting of the Woman's Missionary Society of the Montreal Methodist Conference, opened in the school room of Sydenham Street church at three o'clock, Tuesday afternoon. The president, Mrs. T. G. Williams, Montreal, occupied the chair at the opening session, and after devotional exercises, a Bible reading was given by Mrs. (Rev.) William Craig, of Kingston.

Reports were submitted from district organizers, and all of them showed increased interest in the work, and the reports were looked upon as being most encouraging. A press committee was appointed, composed of Mrs. H. A. Lavell, Smith's Falls, (convener); Mrs. P. A. Reid, Montreal; Mrs. M. Taylor, Perth; Mrs. J. H. Good, Ottawa; Mrs. Reynolds, Kemptville.

Second vice-president—Mrs. W. I. Shaw, Montreal. Third vice-president—Mrs. J. C. Hughes, Athens. Corresponding secretary—Mrs. J. A. Gordon, Westmount. Treasurer—Mrs. R. C. Antill, Ottawa.

Recording secretary—Mrs. E. Grose, Huntingdon. Mrs. Nash, of Ironville, was elected secretary of mission boards and circles. Mrs. Omar L. Kilborn, engaged in missionary work in China, gave an account of some of the work accomplished there, and referred to the many opportunities afforded for this greater effort to be put forth for the great cause of missions. The address proved a most interesting one, and served to stir up renewed effort on the part of all the missionary societies.

LIVE STOCK MARKET. The Prices Paid at the Various Centres. Montreal, June 8.—About 225 head of butchers' cattle, 56 calves, 407 sheep and lambs, and 1,786 fat hogs were offered for sale at the 17th St. Charles stockyards this forenoon. Trade was rather slow, but the prices of cattle remain at about last week's rates. Prime beefs sold at 57c. to 61c. per pound; pretty good animals, 47c. to near 51c., and the common stock, 31c. to 41c. per pound. Calves sold at from 85 to 88 each. Sheep are lower in price, at from 41c. cents to 51c. per lb. Good lots fat hogs sold at 64c. to 66c. per pound.

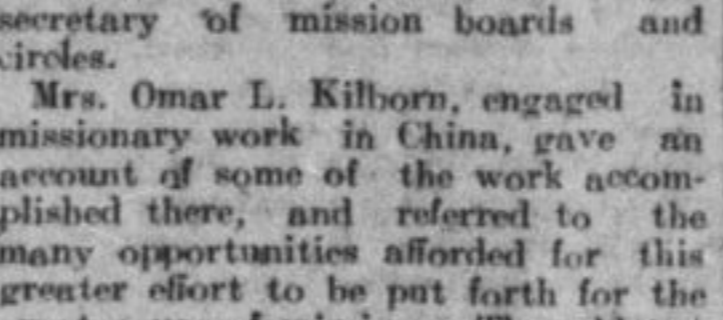

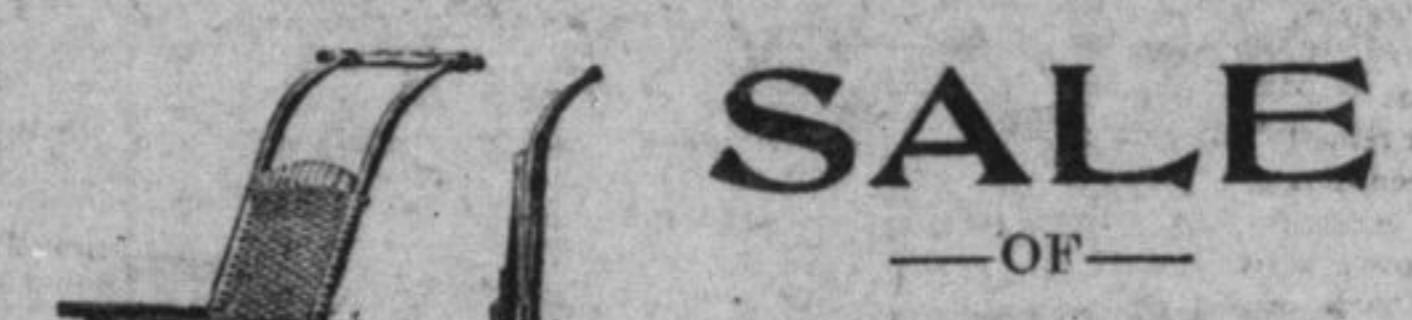
