A GOOD TYPE OF MAN. The governor of North Carolina may say to the governor of South Carolina, when they meet, according to tradition, "It's a long time between drinks," but the saying will not be characteristic of the life and service of other gentlemen if of the Charles H. Hughes type.

Mr. Hughes is not a boastful person. He is not congratulating himself that his determination or diplomacy are succeeding beyond measure, but he is resting easily in his success. He is seeing through the extra session of the legislature at present some of the measures which are rounding out so well his busy term of just two years.

Mr. Foster, after a day had been spent in discussing the railway department's estimates, graciously allowed a sum of \$8,250,000 to pass. Mr. Foster, much more than Mr. Braden, is leading the opposition nowadays.

The Hamilton scandal over the alleged sale, or proffered sale, of ballots may be the result of a joke or game of bluff, but it is not creditable to the returning officer. He should not have entrusted the ballots to any joker.

The political machine is very much denounced, and by some people who used it in their day, but there is a virtue in the voting machine which is operated so successfully in New York state. It does away with the paper ballot and does its work well.

Provincial Gains. The liberals in Ontario have nineteen out of 106. The conservatives in Quebec, according to latest returns, have thirteen in a house of seventy-four, or almost eighteen per cent. in each case of the total membership.

Bourassa's Plan. "We are not disturbed that Mr. Bourassa goes to Quebec. If he has a mission to fulfil, he will fulfil it. We have not the faintest idea what it is, but when he has related it to practical form, we shall be in a better condition to either approve or condemn it.
