A parole post agreement between the United States and France has been signed.

The Essex Fusiliers will go full strength to Quebec to take part in the tercentenary celebration there next month.

Hon. J. O. Reame's majority over Archibald McNeel in the recent provincial election, in North Essex, has been 1,250.

There will be established in a few days a postal car service on New York Central trains between Montreal and Malone, N.Y.

The work of deepening the Crane Island channel, below Quebec, so as to provide a thirty-foot channel at low water, is about completed.

The Congregational Union has recommended its committee to press for the completion of the basis of union with the Presbyterian and Methodist bodies.

The yacht Bessie, owned and sailed by Captain McDowell, went ashore at Nine Mile Point during the forty-five hour gale that struck Oswego from the northwest on Sunday.

C. G. Gendron, a shoe maker, from Penitanguishene, was almost over come by asphyxiating gas in the Hotel Albion, Toronto.
