## "BLIND TOM" DEAD

### THOS. WIGGINS KNOWN TO THREE GENERATIONS.

Slaves' Child, Born in 1849—Sightless and Mentally Deficient, Negro Could Perform Any Composition He Heard.

New York, June 17.—Thomas Wiggins, known to three generations as "Blind Tom," widely known as a piano player, died Saturday in the home of Mrs. Elizabeth Bedune, 121st St., No. 66, Twelfth street, Hoboken. He suffered a stroke of paralysis, the second within a comparatively recent period and died soon afterward.

"Blind Tom" was born near Columbus, Ga., May 25th, 1849, his parents being slaves and of pure negro blood. At an early age he developed his wonderful gift, and as a boy pianist he toured this country, and will be remembered by many, elderly men and women to-day as a sensation of two continents.

He was always known as "Blind Tom," he was never totally blind, and could always distinguish between light and dark. Mentally, he was never much better than an imbecile, and those who saw him on his first concert tours, nearly half a century ago, will remember that he would always stand by the piano and clap his hands with the audience, which was applauding his remarkable skill. This was a trick which he retained as long as he appeared in public.

Early in life he developed the ability to reproduce on a piano any music that he ever heard. His case attracted the attention of scientists as well as musicians, and he made several fortunes for his managers.

"Blind Tom's" death has been announced many times. It was said that he perished in the Johnston flood and several other times, but those who saw him when he appeared in the Circle Theatre in 1904, recognized in the aged white haired man the same wonderful pianist they had seen years before as a boy prodigy. He appeared frequently in vaudeville during the last few years.

## THE SPORT REVIEW.

**Interesting News From the Various Sporting Fields.**

The Guelph franchise in the Ontario Professional Baseball league, has been transferred to St. Thomas.

The Canadian Olympic team is training hard aboard the SS. Tunisia. The men have to rise every morning at 6.30 and work for an hour.

No man in Australasia, and probably no man in all the world, says the Melbourne Argus, ever owned as many good horses as the late George G. Stead, of New Zealand.

N.L.U. referees are strictly enforcing the goal-crease rule this season. Prior to the Capital-National game, Desno Brown told the referee that a man interfering with the goal-keeper would go to the bench for ten minutes. And his warning had good results.

For the third time in succession, Capt. Gordon Henderson won the race of the Hamilton Riding Club horses, ridden by members of the club. In 1906 he won it with Land's End, and last year he won with Thomond, the horse that won so handsily Monday.

A Sydney cable says: In the town hall, on Tuesday, Sir Harry Rawson, the governor, handed to M. A. Noble, the famous cricketer, the public testimonial, consisting of £2,000 and a silver service, presented to him in recognition of his services to Australian cricket.

Montreal Herald: Longboat, the famous Olympic long distance runner, may settle in Montreal on his return from the Olympic games. While he was here last week, Longboat expressed to a few of the prominent sporting men of the city his desire to settle down here.

The Westminster Lacrosse club has finally decided to send the local team east after the Minto cup. The championship games are to be played on July 21st and 28th. No exhibition games will be played on the way down, but matches will be arranged for on the return journey.

Ottawa Capitals will be much stronger for their lacrosse game in Cornwall next Saturday. Bousie Huton will be in the net, and McDonald, who is a good one, will play point. Roller Stars will be on the home end of the team, and these changes it is expected will make a decided improvement in the team.

## RAISE AGE LIMIT.

**Amended Bill Restricting Use of Tobacco.**

Ottawa, June 17.—Mr. Aylesworth's bill to restrain the use of tobacco by young persons was put through the committee stage, and stands for third reading, when Mr. Bain, of Peel, will move an amendment to prohibit the manufacture and sale of cigarettes altogether. While in committee an amendment was agreed to increasing the age limit from sixteen years to eighteen years.

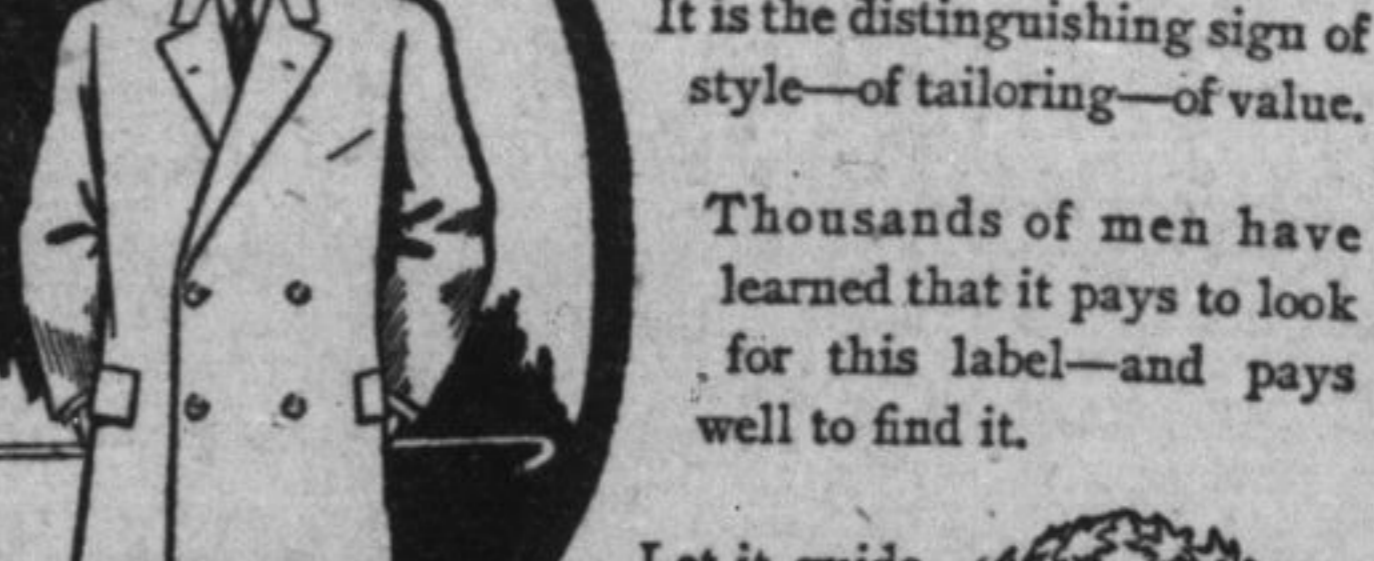
