

Galt, Ont., June 23 .- A diabolical crime was committed at the Central hotel stables, Sunday, when two valuable horses were killed under the most revolting circumstances. The horses, working people out of employment in which belonged to farmers, were treated in a manner that is unnameable The instrument employed was broomhandle, and the fiendish job was accomplished swiftly and unobserved. Chief of Police German, when called
