IS THE DANGER OF ICE IN HUDSON BAY.

Boats Would Have to Be Built Very Stoutly and Would Be Slow-The Crops Could Not Be Moved the Same Year.

Montreal, July 4.-Capt. Gray, o the Hadson's Bay Supply company's ship Pelican, now in port, has had thirty-seven years experience in the navigation of Hudson Bay and contiguous waters, and is naturally greatly interested in the recent declarations by Canadian ministers that a railway must be, built from the western grain fields to Fort Churchill, to provide an additional outlet to Europe for Canada's growing grain supplies. He does not attach the same value to the Hudson Bay route as appears to be held in government circles. In the first place it is dangerous at all times on account of the immense quantities of ice moving about and vessels would have to be built so stoutly to provide safety that they would be necessarily very slow. Then, again, the route is only navigable for a period each summer of between three and four months and even then the ice danger is still there. One season's gram crop could not be hoved until the following July or August, which would be a great draw-
