

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Homestead Regulations.

ANY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 3 and 25, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry of proxy may, however, be made by an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee \$5.00. At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim within 90 days or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500.00 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with, the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10.00 a mile per annum. Royalty, 2 1/2 per cent. after the output exceeds \$10,000.

A VERY PRETTY SOUTHERN COTTAGE.

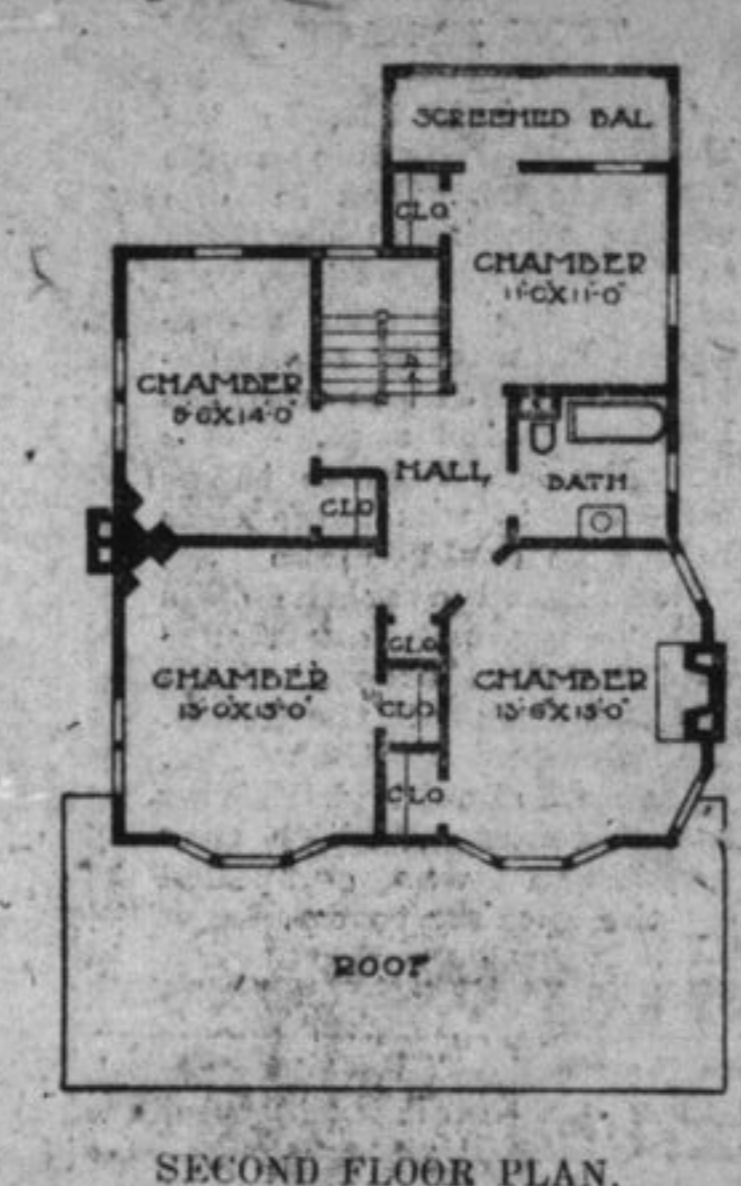
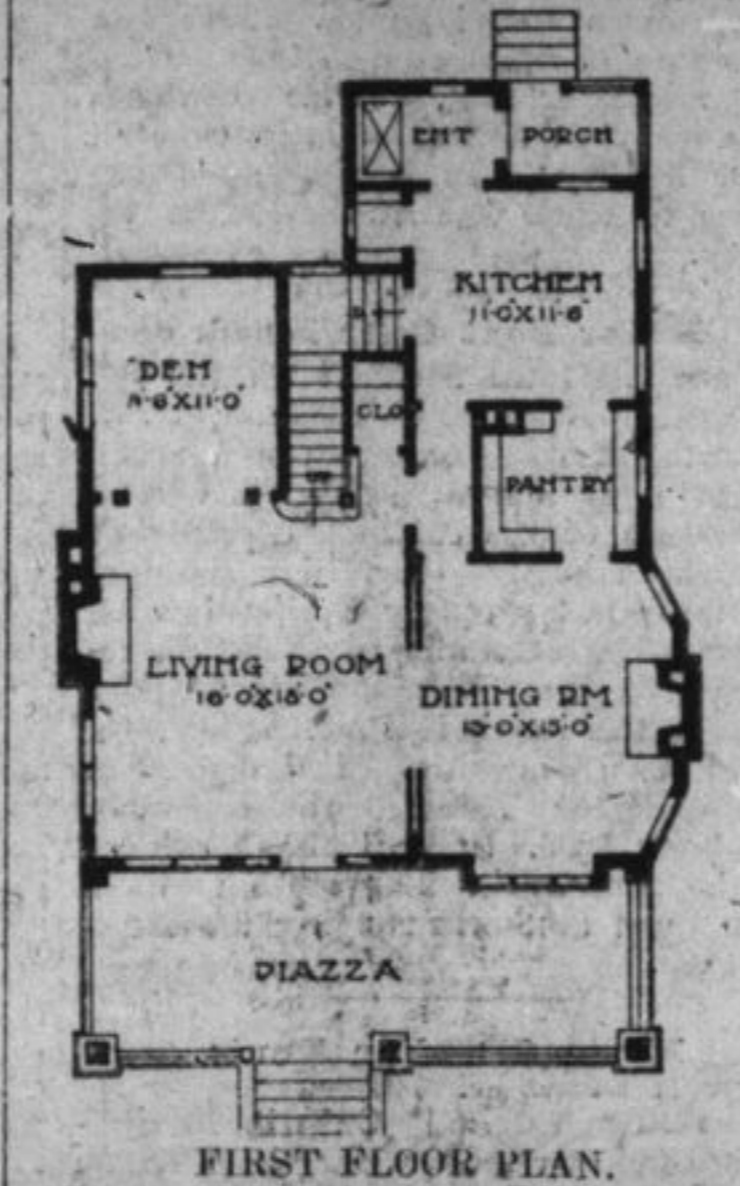
Designed by Charles S. Sedgwick, Architect, Minneapolis, Minn.



This design is intended for a warm climate. There are three separate chimneys, affording a fireplace in the living room and dining room and fireplaces in three chambers on the second floor. There is a small basement under the kitchen portion, with an opportunity to put in a heater if desired. This same plan, with a good foundation and basement, under the entire house and walls properly built and backlastered, would be equally well adapted to a colder climate. The cost of the house as designed is \$3,500, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

The style of the exterior treatment is a little on the Italian order, with low pitch roof and wide projected eaves. The two principal chimneys, one at each side of the house, are designed to be carried up on the outside, built of brick with a small portion of stone. This house has all the conveniences and comforts that will be required for the average home, the large living room, with the pleasant den opening out of it through the columbed arch, can be treated in many ways to make a charming place for home gatherings. The den is suited for a gentleman's room or for a

small library with books, desks, etc. The dining room, with its spacious pantry and kitchen arrangement, forms a very attractive feature in the front of the house and opening as it does with sliding doors from the living room. The chambers are all provided with ample closets and the bathroom is roomy and well arranged, as well as very conveniently located.

WORK IS COMPLETED

ST. CLAIR TUNNEL FULLY ELECTRIFIED.

Important Feature of Grand Trunk's New Route From East to West of Canada via Chicago.

The great work of installing electric power, and incidentally, electric light, in the St. Clair tunnel, has now been completed. The powerful electric locomotives now in use handling thirty per cent. more in tonnage each trip and handle it at thirty per cent. greater speed.

In view of the fact that on the 14th inst. the Grand Trunk will open a new route from Eastern to Western Canada via Chicago, this announcement will be as interesting to the travelling public as it is gratifying to the Grand Trunk management. The improvements made on the Grand Trunk system within the past decade are many and varied, but if one piece of good work might be singled from the many, perhaps the electrification of the St. Clair tunnel would be considered the crowning achievement of them all. Hereafter nervous people, who used to fancy they could smell smoke when the engineer whistled for Sarnia west-bound or for Port Huron east-bound, can sleep sweetly while the great electric motors swing them under the river from one flag to the other—for the tunnel is now as clear and clean as a mountain canon and as light as day.

This new effort of the Grand Trunk to secure its share of the traffic between the eastern and the western provinces brings into active and energetic operation the first real, keen, clear-cut competition between Canada's two giant railways for this business.

The work of building the Grand Trunk Pacific up to the standard set by the better will necessarily occupy some time, but the Grand Trunk management evidently does not propose to await the completion of this western line before going after their share of the business of the west. With their splendid double track line from Quebec and Ontario to Chicago, upon which fifteen million dollars have been expended, they feel that they can now put up a service which for speed and comfort will not suffer by comparison with the best provided by the railways of the American continent.

This contest, if it may be called a contest, does not, of course, partake of the nature of a rat war. It is not war, but merely one of the divisions which try the mettle of railway managers and contribute to the excitement of railway life, if not to the "gaity of nations."

CANNIBALISM NOT EXTINGUISHED.

Still Practiced in Interior of New Guinea.

Melbourne, July 17.—Reuter's representative has had an interview with the bishop of New Guinea, who has given some interesting particulars of the condition of affairs there. Asked with regard to the prevalence of cannibalism, the bishop said: "Cannibalism is no longer practised along the coast line, which is now quite safe, but inland it still continues. Recently some extraordinary cases were brought to our notice at the headquarters at Samarai of natives having been killed and cooked in unusually revolting circumstances, but cases of this sort are only to be met with in those regions where the government has yet scarcely penetrated.

"During my last trip I found the natives very friendly. The magistrate with whom I was travelling informed me that during a previous journey he had come across a raiding party, all arrayed in their hideous war paint, who were carrying the bodies of four young girls on poles. Their heads had been beaten in, and they were tied to the poles by their wrists. At first the cannibals showed fight, but seeing that the magistrate and his police were armed with rifles, they dropped the bodies and escaped into the jungle. The magistrate ordered his men to cut sharp pointed stakes from the neighboring trees, with which they dug graves and interred the bodies of the victims."

Speaking on the subject of the curious race of swamp-dwellers, to be found in some portions of New Guinea, Bishop Stone Wigg said: "These swamp-dwellers have been wiped out by other hostile tribes, and when I heard last there was only one survivor of them. These people lost the use of their lower limbs, owing to the fact that they were perpetually sitting in their canoes. They were formed as other men, but their legs became atrophied from disuse."
