DOWN AT QUEBEC

THE ARRIVAL OF PRINCE A NOTABLE EVENT.

The Whig's Correspondent Had a Few Words With Many of the Notables at the Celebration.

Special to the Whig. Quebec, July 22.—Press passes were issued this afternoon, giving all newspaper seats within twenty-five feet of the chair placed at the disposal of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, on the King's wharf. At 3:30 p.m. the Indomitable and Minotaur have in sight away down the river and a general royal salute from all the warships in the harbor signalled the long looked for fact.

The Indomitable and Minotaur cast anchor in the river and the usual complimentary calls were made and returned by the naval officers. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Lord Roberts, Earl Grey and others went on board the Indomitable and extended greetings to the prince, and exactly at 4:10 p.m. the prince stepped ashore. Again the cannons boomed, hands played and everybody cheered louder and stronger, if possible, than before.
