THEY DEMANDED MONEY. BLACKMAILER'S THREAT TO KILL WHOLE FAMILY.

Millionaire, Receives Letters Telling How Each of His Children Would Be Slain.

Munich, July 25.—In a crowded court the trial began at Munich, of Bernhard Imhof, an ex-postal assistant, aged thirty-two, for attempted blackmailing of the millionaire Bavarian manufacturer, Herr Wilhelm Ludovici.

Although of good family and superior education, Imhof has already served a sentence of five years for embezzlement, and confessed that he wrote to Herr Ludovici, who is worth \$19,000,000, demanding sums ranging from \$2,000 to \$500,000, under threat of killing off his children one by one until his terms were agreed to, and of finally robbing the millionaire of his own eyesight.

UNITED STATES TO BRITAIN.

Address of Fairbanks—Reply of Prince.

Quebec, July 25.—In addressing the prince during the exercises Vice-President Fairbanks, of the United States, said:

Permit me to extend to Quebec my hearty congratulations upon the distinction which she enjoys in the presence of your royal highness and upon the enthusiasm with which she has welcomed you within her gates. It is, indeed, a signal honor which you have done her.

The eyes of the western world are upon this historic city. The celebration of the tercentenary of Champlain's founding of Quebec is altogether admirable, both in the comprehensiveness of its conception, and in the excellence of its execution, and is an event which awakens interest not only in the Dominion of Canada, but in the United States also.

Three hundred years is but a brief period in the history of England or France, but it is all the history of Quebec and all of Anglo-Saxon America. Here has been written an interesting story. Here have been witnessed the victories and defeats of war and the blessed triumphs of peace.

It is with unusual pleasure I bring you greetings from the president and the people of the United States who rejoice with you in the progress you have made in the manifold ways which make for the strength and honor of a great people.

The United States and Canada have but fairly entered upon their careers. Each has vast areas, either sparsely settled or unoccupied where many will make their homes in the future.
