CONFERRING OF TITLES. Sir James Whitney is said to have received so many congratulations from his friends and admirers, upon his knighthood, as to feel that it will be some time before he can adequately acknowledge them.

Public opinion is changing with respect to titles and decorations. Mr. Mackenzie and Mr. Blake, who served their country long and with great acceptability, are understood to have declined knighthood, and the greatest liberal of his time, the most conspicuous personality in British history during no one, was contented to remain plain Mr. Gladstone, and was none the less esteemed and loved on that account.

The deprecation of Canadians is not intended to separate them from their fellows or mark them out for special social distinction. It is the symbol of kindly favour, and is conferred only on those who have in some way, in public or civil life, earned the honor which it conveys.
