### FINED THE HOTEL MEN.

Convicted of Selling Liquor in Prohibited Hours. John Woodruff and Joseph Bromley, proprietors of the American hotel, Sydneyham, appeared before Police Magistrate Lawson in Kingston, on Saturday, charged with serving liquor to N. C. Sinner and Francis Partridge, government detectives, on Sunday, August 2nd. The defendants pleaded "not guilty." Sinner and Partridge swore that on the Sunday mentioned they received white wheat, whiskey and ale from Joseph Bromley behind the bar. Partridge told of receiving liquor earlier in the morning from Bromley, while he and another man were in the bar. Sinner and Bromley positively denied the charges. He had never sold liquor in prohibited hours. John Woodruff knew nothing of the affair, as he was away. The police magistrate imposed a fine of \$75 and costs. Another charge against the same men was withdrawn. The next case called was that of Daniel Graves, Harrowsmith, charged with selling liquor on July 11th. Mr. Rigney appeared for the defendant and pleaded guilty. A fine of \$50 and costs was imposed. Another information was laid against Graves for selling liquor on July 11th without a license. He pleaded guilty and was fined \$40 and costs or one month. Mr. Ayerst asked for an order to destroy the intoxicating liquor found at Harrowsmith.
