

Synopsis of Canadian North West Homestead Regulations.

ANY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, containing 8 and 25, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

OPPORTUNITIES. The other day the Detroit Free Press observed that "there is just as much chance for the rising generation as there has been for any generation.

Give them healthy bodies, well stocked minds and a determination to succeed, and they will make their place in the world."

Commenting on this The New York Herald remarks: "Our esteemed contemporary is right. There is too much 'loose talk' these days about lack of openings for young men.

The Canadian Gazette has felt it necessary to explain why the applications to the English capitalists for loans, by the municipalities, have increased in recent years.

"Many of the Canadian towns," it remarks, "and cities have grown very rapidly, and have in consequence leaped much more heavily upon their bankers. Several can be mentioned in the west, borrowing less than \$100,000 a few years ago, that got up above \$500,000 last year.

Also, of course, scores of new places came into existence, many of them now borrowing respectable sums. Thus the aggregate amount required from the banks swelled enormously.

But at the same time the demand from commercial borrowers attained heavy proportions. Mostly it was of a more profitable nature than the municipal business.

So, quite generally, banking pressure was put upon the municipalities to borrow in England whenever possible, so as to leave the banks more free to take care of industry and trade and to increase the supply of capital available for Canadian development.

The Gazette comments upon the manner in which the Canadian securities are being required by the Canadian people, and to the extent of \$25,000,000 a year.

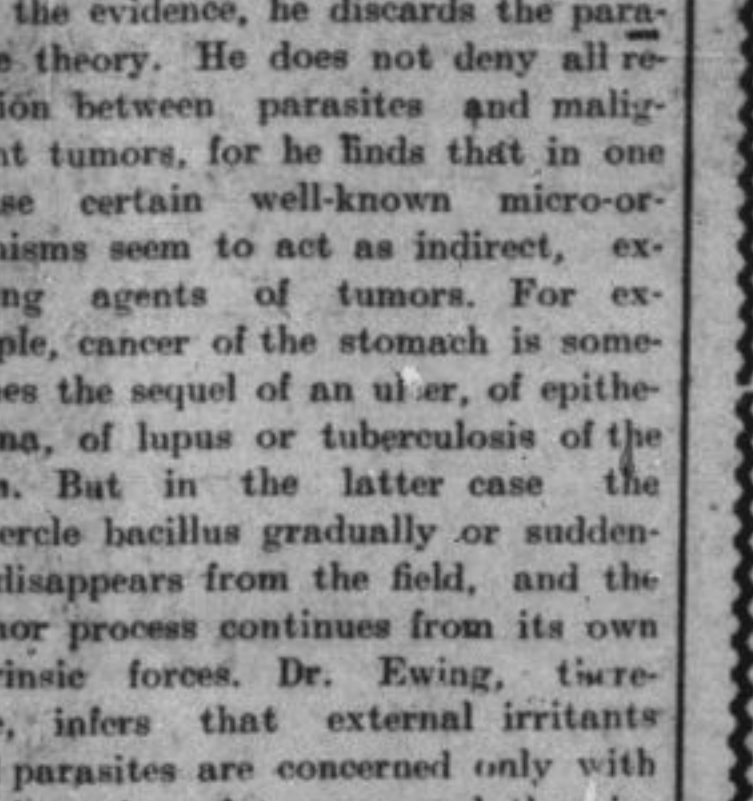
The buyers are not the people of the cities and towns only, but of the agricultural districts as well, for the accumulator of funds is most anxious to invest in something which will give him more than the current bank interest, and there is nothing so stable and so easily handled as the municipal bond.

The councils are, however, subject to the same desire for inflation as the merchant and manufacturer when the times are good. Previous to the last acute financial crisis, some of the municipalities were inclined to great extravagance, and a few of them, with a craze for municipal ownership, were tempted to indulge in rash experiments.

It was a god-send that the banks shut down upon them, and that some of the wildest schemes were abandoned—for the time at least. The day is coming—and it may be very near—when the legislature will require an annual return of the assets and liabilities of the municipality, and when it will be necessary to submit the plans of any expensive undertaking to some central body before there can be an issue of bonds in connection with it.
