

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

A NY even-numbered section of Do-minion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be home-steaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be made an Agency on certain conditions by the sather, mother, son, daughter, brother or aster of an intending homesteader.

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be figible for homestead entry. DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the lind in each year during the term' of

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned olely by him, not less than eighty (86) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in larti will not meet this requirement

(3) If the father (or mother, if the ther is deceased) of a homesteader had permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (of mother). (4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as mean-ing not more than nine miles in a direct

WEST MINING REGULATIONS, COAL.-Coal mining rights may be rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton,

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee \$5.00. At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the mining Recorder. When \$500.00 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00, DREDGING,-Two leases of five miles sach of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10.00 a mile per annum. Royalty, 21 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,-
