That live stock requires a certain imount of salt is unquestionable, but in the manner of feeding it there can be considerable improvement. Most breeders are content to throw a lump of rock salt on the ground, or in the feed box, allowing the animal to like up almost as much dirt as salt. A more sanitary method of feeding salt is being introduced among the breeders of Canada by the Salt Specialty Company.


