

INHALING OXYGEN.

THE LATEST FAD AMONG LONDON SMART SET.

Chemists supply cylinders of the gas, which is taken as a stimulant—its use rapidly spreading, especially among Society Women.

London, Aug. 18.—A new fad has invaded London, that of inhaling oxygen as a stimulant for mind and supply cylinders of oxygen to regular body. Several West End chemists customers, whose numbers are growing. According to one of these chemists, several society women are devotees of the habit, and reputable physicians acknowledge that with the increased facilities for its supply its use is rapidly spreading.

The gas is applied compressed in iron cylinders fitted with a tap, and, on attaching a rubber tube and funnel, a stream of gas, gentle or strong, can be applied at will in any direction. Usually two or three minutes' inhalation of a gentle stream mixed with air is sufficient at a time.

Read This:

As to the general use of the gas indiscriminately by the public, medical opinion is adverse. It is unquestionably a powerful and valuable stimulant, but excessive use is dangerous. The ozone form of oxygen in minute quantities is, of course, excellent, but when inhaled in larger quantities it becomes a dangerous poison, causing headache and irritation of the mucous membrane and so on. So also pure oxygen is absolutely dangerous and must be largely diluted.

TWO HUSBANDS LEGAL.

Bigamy Given Official Standing By French Court.

Paris, Aug. 18.—Bigamy has just been given official standing by the fifth chamber of the Paris appeal court, which has confirmed a judgment of the civil tribunal declaring that a woman living in Paris named Raoul, and also to a Danie living in Copenhagen, is legally the wife of both.

Even the authors of the "Divorce" comedy, "Les Surprises du Divorce," never could have imagined such a complicated situation. The first marriage was contracted in Paris in 1902. It came to an end a few years later in Denmark, when M. and Mrs. Raoul were then living.

When the decree of separation on the ground of incompatibility of temperament was granted to them shortly afterward, Mme. Raoul petitioned to the authorities to transform the decree of separation into absolute divorce.

The petition being granted, she remarried, this time with a Dane, this appearing Danish nationality. But as divorce is not recognized in the French law, the first husband finds he cannot contract a fresh marriage so long as his first wife lives or until the first marriage has been formally nullified.

Raoul has no means of getting the marriage nullified. Believing that the French court would accept his wife's remarriage as a justification for his divorce, he appealed for a decree. His demand has just been definitely rejected, the court holding that while a wife contracts the first marriage in perfect good faith and in accordance with the Danish law to which she is now subject, therefore, she cannot be accused of maintaining unlawful relations with another man, an accusation which, if proved, would constitute ground for divorce as that man is her lawful husband.

So, M. Raoul finds that he is married, while his wife is not—at least, not to him—and into the bargain the French law regards him as the legal father of the children that may be born to his former wife and her Danish husband.

WAS AN EMBEZZLER.

He Was Caught in Ottawa, on Tuesday Morning.

Ottawa, Aug. 18.—Edward Cotteringham, the defaulting treasurer of the Ottawa Tractor company, of Tipton, Indiana, who embezzled \$5,000 of the company's funds in June, and fled the country, was arrested in Ottawa, this morning, by Chief Detective Hicks, of this city, and Detective Devault, of Ottawa. Cotteringham was about to open a wine store in Ottawa, and had secured premises on Nicholas street. The local police recognized him from a description and wired to Tipton. He proved to be the right man.

MAY TALK ALSO

Besides Studying German Methods and Customs.

Berlin, Aug. 18.—The coming visit to Berlin of David Lloyd George, the British chancellor of the exchequer, is causing much interest in official circles. He says he is only coming to study German methods and customs. Hints, however, have fallen that Lloyd George probably also will discuss an arrangement between the two countries in the future for a reduction in the outlay for armaments.

The Third This Week.

Ottawa, Aug. 18.—Another earthquake shock, the third this week, was recorded at the Dominion observatory, at 6:26 o'clock, this morning, and lasted twenty-five minutes. It was probably the slight shock at Eureka, on the north-west point of the California coast, near San Francisco.

RICH DEMAND TICKER.

Cruises Fail to Take Minds From Business.

New York, Aug. 18.—The famous annual cruise of the New York Yacht Club, now in progress, has an added feature this year which will be the despair of the cynics. Among the many yachts in the fleet are a number of steamers, and as some of these are as big as ocean liners, and frequently cross the seas, they are supplied with wireless outfits.

Such being the case, their owners are anxious for land stations to send to the yachts the stock market ticker news, and this being received on the steam yachts, it is passed along by flag code signals to the sailing craft. Now, if you please, consider the situation: Here are a number of very wealthy men, so wealthy that they can keep in commission large and expensive steam yachts, and they are off on a pleasure cruise with the famous annual cruise of the New York Yacht Club. Yet those men are such slaves to the ticker that the delight and excitement of yachting, the pleasure of sailing up the beautiful sound, the fun of visiting after anchoring at a port of call, cannot be enjoyed by them without thought of their investments.

PROPER VENTILATION.

Sixty Degrees Temperature For Sleeping Room.

Beauty sleep, to fulfil its name, must be taken under certain marked conditions or it fails to accomplish its purpose. For instance, ventilation and proper temperature form a most important part in the treatment, for there should be a free circulation of air and no draught. To secure fresh air it is better that the windows shall be open at the top than at the bottom, for the former makes it possible for impurities to escape from the room, says the New York Evening Telegram. By all means the most hygienic way of fixing a window for the night is to open it at both top and bottom, so that pure, cold air may enter, and the warm, impure atmosphere which is leaving, sixty degrees is an excellent temperature for the sleeping room, and to regulate the air to this mark keep a small thermometer above the bed, and watch it so that the air may not be overheated. The room may not be overheated, but the person who can acquire greater cold need not fear to have it, for the lungs will never be injured by such treatment. On the contrary, the more cold, fresh air that is given them to inhale the more healthy will be their condition, make the complexion clearer and the eyes brighter. It is also necessary to enter the room to take the places of the warm, impure atmosphere which is leaving.
