

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Homestead Regulations.

ANY cro-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 2 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

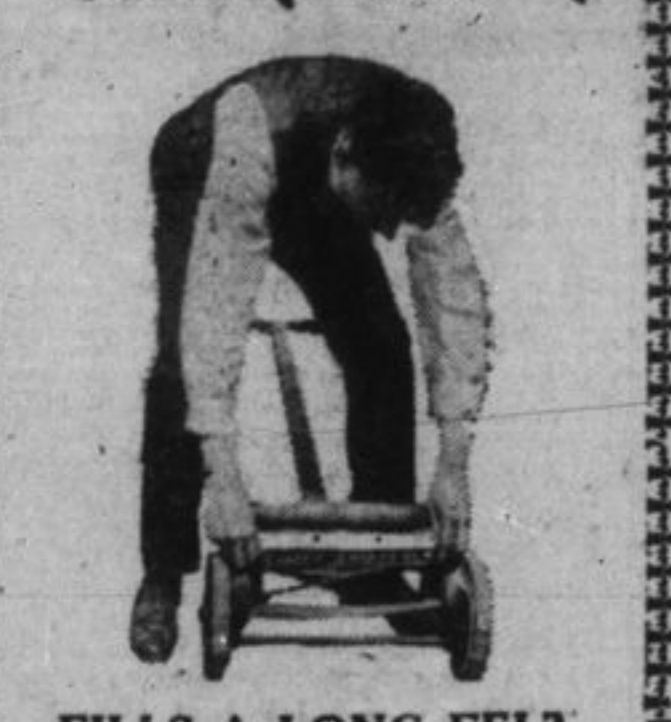
SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Ent. fee, \$5.00.

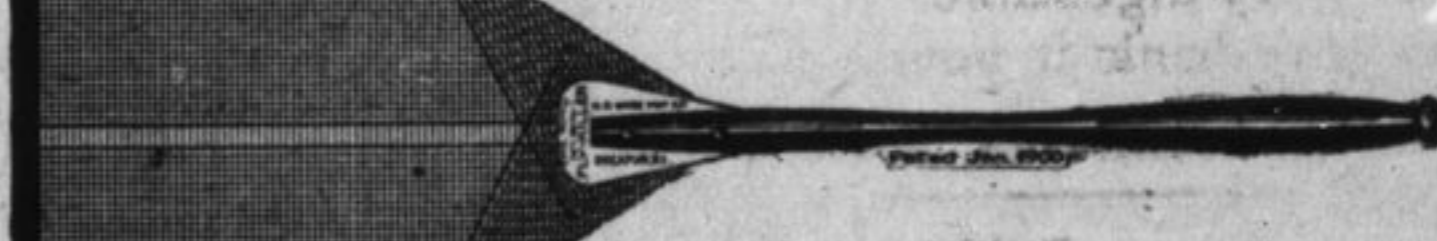
