

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Homestead Regulations.

ANY unincorporated section of Dominion Lands or Sub-agency of Northwest Provinces, excepting...

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency...

Application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the first three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the requisite residence duties by living on the land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent...

(3) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him...

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre...

QUARTZ.—Persons eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet...

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be granted to one applicant for a term of 20 years.
