ROCKEFELLER'S OFFER HELPS THE SOUTHERN BAPTISTS IN GOOD WORK.

Contributes \$150,000 to Fund Being Raised For Purpose of Establishing a University.

New York, Sept. 3.—At the first step toward enrolling a great Baptist university in the south, as he has done in the case of Chicago University, in the north, John D. Rockefeller, through the General Education Board of this city, has offered Richmond College, Richmond, Va., \$150,000 on condition that the trustees of the state raise an additional \$250,000.
