

PICTURES HORRORS REALM OF CZAR.

Chicago Detective Says Russia in Terror-Little Protection For Life and Property.

Chicago, Sept. 4.-The police of Russia are used for the purpose of harassing political enemies of the government and not for the protection of life and property, while something akin to reign of terror exists among the people most of the time. That is the deduction of Detective Make Mills, who has just returned grom the duty of taking a Russian murderer from Chicago to Rus-

Detective Mills denied that a whole congregation of Russians had been flogged by Cossacks because some one had stolen whitewashing implements from a church which was being renovated, or that he had seen twenty boys and men executed. He was quoted as having made these and other sensational statements. But the detective stated that conditions are actually so bad in the domain of the Czar that it is quite unnecessary for the traveller to exaggerate his experiences

"Things are very bad in Russia," said Detective Mills, 'and there's a kind of reign of terror there. The police are used to prosecute men and women who say something against the Czar or government, and accordingly the police force has no time to protect life and property. The functions of the American and Russian police are entirely unlike. The consequence is that life and property don't get much protection in

"There are many executions in Russia of which the world never hears. .In Libau, Odessa and some other cities I visited I was told there are twenty or more executions of military prisoners

"Sometimes men and boys are shot within a few hours after their arrest. These prisoners call themselves revolutionists, but in many cases are blackmailers and terrorists. They write threatening letters to persons with property, demanding sums of money, and if they don't get what they ask for they carry out the threats in their letters. "At Merzalkowa, near Odessa, there was for a time a fire in one or another of the buildings of a wealthy merchant every night. Finally a lieutenant of

the merchant had any more trouble. The fire stopped. "In one town some whitewashing in plements were stolen from a church that was being repaired. Several innocent persons were flogged in the hope of find-

ing the thief. "The financial condition of the country is pitable. The masses of the people are very poor, and beggars seem to infest the whole empire."

Mills took the Russia Meffodi Zeirnosekow, a Russian fugitive wanted in Libau for killing four peasant women. At Libau Mills gave his prisoner to the Russian authorities and the man was executed within a week.

Six Vultures Fly O'er London Streets.

It was also a lamentable lack of knowledge of the habits of vultures which led a German resident of the square to shoot one of the birds on Sunday morning. The vulture in question, attracted by some pieces of meat in back yard, suddenly swooped down toward them, when the German, greatly

perturbed, fired at it with a gun at close range and shot it dead. Two of Mr. 'Hamlyn's assistants ac counted for another of the birds. Pass ing through a dimly lit warehouse loft they emerged upon a flat roof, and discreetly approached the vulture, which was perched-with its back toward them -upon a narrow coping. The bird appeared either to be dozing or to be lost in reflection. Then there was a sudden rush, the rapid flinging of a net and frenzied flapping of wings. The watching crowd cheered as the vulture was
