

AN even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person, the sole head of a family or male over 18 years of age, to whom the section is not owned.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$100.00 per acre. Not more than 2,500 acres may be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim on a mineral land owned by him or his wife, or both, for a period of six months. At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the mining recorder. When \$100.00 has been expended, the claim may be sold or transferred to another.
