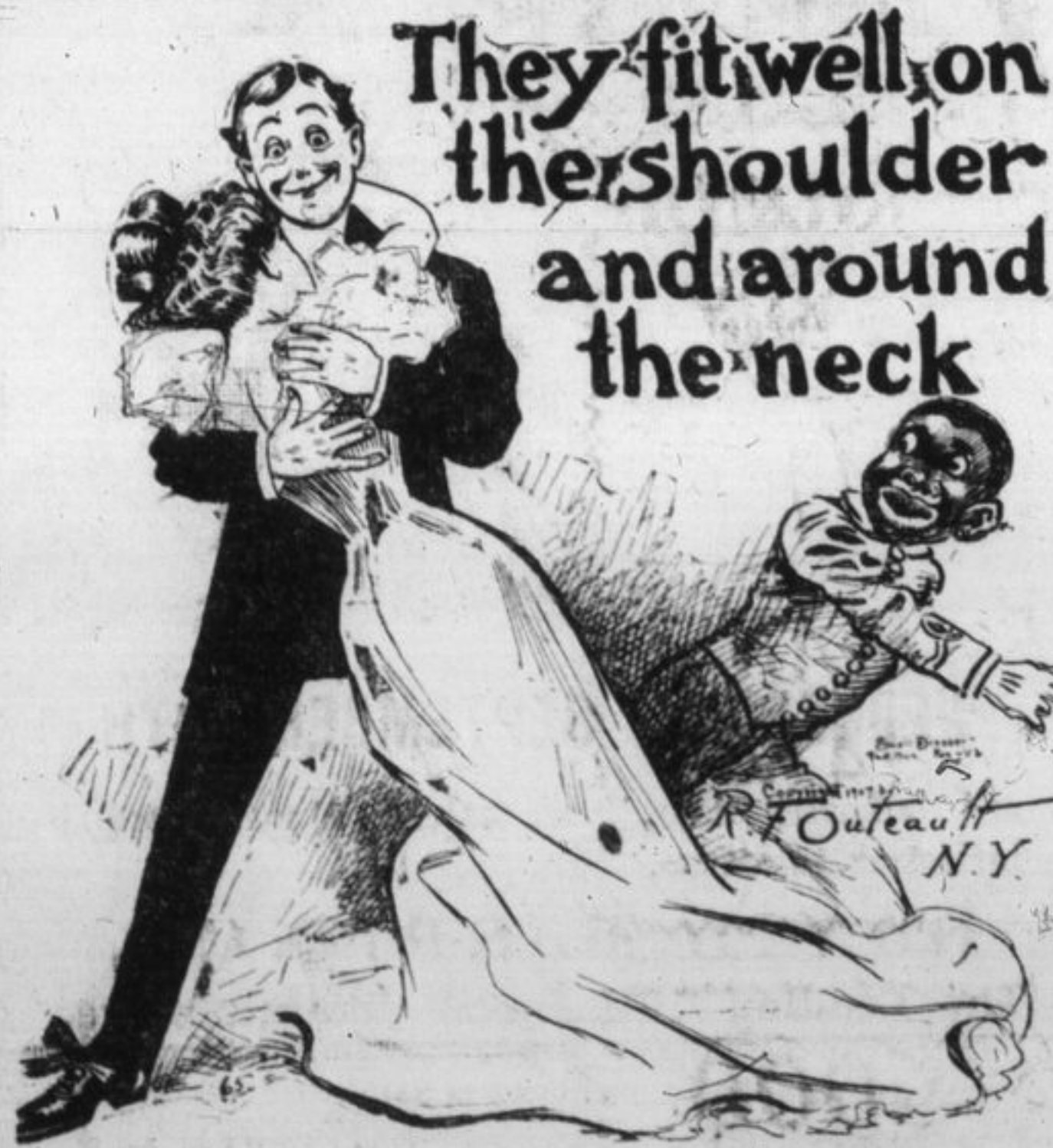

THE NEWS OF WORLD

OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

Matters That Interest Everybody - Notes From All Over - Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

No yield at Portage la Prairie has gone below twenty bushels to the acre.

The C.N.R. will be extended from Regina to Calgary, says William MacKenzie.

Mrs. Lizzie Lanove, of Waldo, Wis., was arrested for the murder of her infant grandson.

Thieves in either Ottawa or Montreal, are stealing sugar, often half a ton at a time.

Rev. H. S. Mahood, of London, has accepted a call to the Congregational church at Paris.

At the conservative convention, John MacKay, Renfrew, was chosen candidate for South Renfrew.

Joseph Blayborough, Brantford, injured in Friday's natural gas explosion, died last night.

Diplomacy in transferring colored children from white schools prevented race troubles at Alton, Ill.

At the Cornwall cheese board, 1,076 boxes were boarded, 501 white, 275 colored; all sold at 12c.

Smoke from forest fires was so dense over St. Clair and Detroit rivers that traffic was suspended last night.

In Chicago, five persons are reported killed in an explosion on the North Side, which occurred on Saturday morning.

Commissions have been issued to Thomas Healy, Kingston, and George H. Bennett, Windsor, as preventative officers.

Archibald Macdonnell, Beekwith township, aged seventy-eight, was killed in a runaway in Carleton Place on Saturday.

Three men walking on the Lake Shore, on Twenty-eighth street, Cleveland, Ohio, were killed, on Saturday morning, by being run over by a train.

Mrs. Samuel Fitzpatrick, of Colorado Springs, claims that she and other heirs have a claim to realty in Philadelphia to the amount of \$120,000,000.

The attendance at the Toronto exhibition, to date, according to Manager Orr, about 750,000 while the gate receipts have increased \$9,575 over last year.

George Keelner, a motorman, was killed and twenty-five passengers were injured in a rear-end collision of two elevated railroad trains on Myrtle avenue, Brooklyn, on Saturday.

Fire of unknown origin, on Saturday, destroyed the Locke Insulator Works, Lima, N.Y., causing a loss of \$75,000 and throwing seventy persons out of employment.

Gus Lampostos, a young Greek caught by the postmaster of Toronto sending indecent postcards through the mails, pleaded guilty and was fined \$5 and costs.

Two more divorce cases are listed for next session. John Hagwood, Sutton West, Ont., seeks divorce from his wife, and Mrs. Evelyn Martha Keller, Toronto, from her husband.

The contract for the recovery of the Algoma Central steamer King Edward, on the rocks off Chantry Island off Southampton, has been given to the Reid Working company.

At Richmond, Va., Lee Strother, a negro, was hanged for attempted criminal assault on Leolo Fry, a young white woman. He made a full confession.

Winnie Young, Winnipeg, a child of tender years, was playing with some companions when her dress was ignited by some means unknown and she was so badly burned that she died.

At St. Catharines, Ont., Magistrate Campbell dismissed the case against the Alexandria Golf Club, charged with selling liquor without a license, on the ground that no liquor was on sale.

William F. Waldman, formerly a member of the New York police department, was sent to prison for extorting money from women on the street while he was doing duty as a patrolman.

H. W. Sweeney, paymaster of the C.P.R., at Windsor, has been promoted to local treasurer of the company at Winnipeg. John Doug, assistant paymaster, has taken over Mr. Sweeney's work.

Fay Oden, the eleven-year-old Topoka, Kas., girl, with her little body literally covered with poisoned wounds from a mad dog's teeth, is slowly recovering at the Pasteur Institute. Her aged grandfather sits by her side all day.

At Berlin, Wilhelm Hagenbreck, of the famous animal training firm of that name, was probably fatally injured, on Saturday, by a huge bear that he was attempting to drive into its quarters.

In a writ against Michael Egan, Joseph Simpson, a Tilbury East farmer, charges the oil man with a list of alleged "false and fraudulent" representations. Egan is described as a "speculator in oil and gas leases."

Fitzgerald Liberated.

Chicago, Sept. 12.—George W. Fitzgerald, accused by the authorities of theft of \$179,000 from the United States sub-treasury here, was freed by Judge Chetlain. U. S. Sub-treasurer Boldenweck, acting on instructions not to disclose evidence gathered by the federal authorities, took the stand and refused to testify. Judge Chetlain thereupon dismissed the case.
