Milan, Sept. 15 .- At the Palermo assizes yesterday severe sentences were passed on four emissaries of the Malia who were concerned, on October 31st last, in kidnapping the two elder daughters of Signor Zocchi, a wellknown dairy proprietor, resident in the Sicilian capital.

The girls, whose ages are seventeen and eighteen, were enjoying an evenng walk with their mother and ounger sisters, when they were seized by eight men and driven off in a couple of carriages, in waiting around a corner. 
