FRENCH HOTEL MYSTERIES.

Link Recent Trunk Murder With Other Crimes.

Paris, Sept. 16.—The judicial inquiry into the crime of Caesar Tasso, who murdered an Armenian woman at Marseilles and hid her body in a trunk, has brought to light some curious facts which the police believe connect him with at least two other murders.

In January last year a brother of Tasso was in Marseilles on business. He was in the best of health and had brought \$6,000 with him. He slept at Tasso's hotel and was found dead in his bed there next morning. The money was never found.

Constantinople, Sept. 16.—A number of distinguished Turkish women have formed a committee called a union, the first women's association on record.

Yesterday they chartered a launch and called upon several persons of distinction, demanding support for benevolent works. The launch stopped before the Bosphorus residence of Riza Pasha, ex-minister of war, who has just been released, and who was frightened almost to death, believing that it came to take him back to prison. He was relieved on ascertaining that it was only the gentle sex demanding money for the poor.
