HARD ON MARINERS WILL WALKS ENDURE THE DAY'S EPISODES

FOG AND SMOKE CAUSE THAT HAVE BEEN MADE FROM LIMESTONE?

Old Timers State It Is Worst Weather of the Kind Ever Experienced—Cape Boat Cancelled For Second Time.

The fog and smoke on the lakes is causing no end of trouble to mariners. Old mariners state that it is the worst weather of the kind that they have ever experienced. Some of the vessels have been able to come across from Oswego and Charlotte, but there has been great loss of time. A large number of boats have been waiting for the weather to change, fearing that it would be far better to lose time than to risk accidents.

"This is the worst I have ever experienced in my time," said an old marine man, to-day, "the smoke, for it is practically all smoke that is causing the trouble, is something awful. You cannot see the length of a vessel, and it is very difficult to keep your course. With sailing vessels the work is made all the more difficult."

Street Paving Question.

Next week, the city engineer may be ready to report on the question of paved streets for the business section. A special meeting of the board of works may be held to receive the report. It is safe to say, however, that no paved roads will be constructed this year. Before a beginning could be made the gas, water and sewer departments and the Bell Telephone company would have to be notified to proceed with whatever excavations they have in view. All bad mains and surfaces must be repaired before paving would be commenced.
