LOCAL NOTES AND THINGS IN GENERAL.

The Tidings From Various Points in Eastern Ontario — What People Are Doing And What They Are Saying.

Wesley Gray, Belleville, is the newly-appointed member of the police force there.

Lish Canniff, Belleville, has left for Rivers, Manitoba, where he has secured a position on the G.T.P. railway.

Richard Simpson, charged with committing a criminal offence against Mrs. Celestine Deline, both of Bancroft, was acquitted.

The charges against Earl Fox and Mrs. Annie Day, accused of wounding the husband of Mrs. Day, will not be tried at this court in Belleville.

The death occurred, Thursday, of Mrs. Amelia Phillips, wife of John Phillips, Albury, Ainsburg. The deceased lady, forty-one years of age, was daughter of Mrs. Samuel Sinfeld, Sidney.

Joseph Barbeau, an unmarried man, twenty-six years of age, died at Belleville hospital, from typhoid fever. Decedent was from Trenton, where he was employed as a lineman for the Bell Telephone company.

Leslie Ogden, aged twenty-eight years, moulder by trade, was knocked down by an engine in the Grand Trunk yards at Port Hope, and was brought to the Belleville hospital, where his arm was amputated at the elbow, and several bad scalp wounds stitched up. He will recover.

Harrowsmith Fever Cases.

Harrowsmith, Oct. 8.—Another has been added to the typhoid fever list, Mrs. Danford Buck, the oldest of Francis Shannon's family, a girl of fourteen, has not as yet taken the fever, making only eight of Mr. Shannon's family who are in the Kingston general hospital. At last report all are doing nicely. It is reported that Mrs. Alexander Thompson has the fever, making fourteen in all. The concert given here, in the hall, on the 2nd, by the three blind artists, was deserving of a better attendance. The revival services held in the Methodist church for three weeks, by Rev. Mr. Whitesides, proved a grand success, having eighty-five converts. Judge Price was here, to-day, revising the voters' list. J. S. Gallagher's new concert block machine has arrived. He intends erecting new concert house soon.

Zealand Items.

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be applied for by the sole head of a family, or male person over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less, if applicable, for homesteading, or may be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be made by an Agency agent, certifying that the applicant, son, daughter, brother or sister of an in-tendee homesteader.

An application for cancellation must be made within six months of the date upon which the land was entered.

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of the four consecutive years of three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farmland owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the same place as the joint ownership.

(3) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs means a distance not more than nine miles in a direct line.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres may be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim of up to 160 acres.

At least \$100.00 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the mining Recorder. When \$100.00 has been expended, or when other requirements comply with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 per acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$3.00.

DRILLING—A permit of up to five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$1.00 per acre per annum. Royalty, 5 per cent. after the output exceeds \$10,000.
