Mrs. Eisenhart is widely known a newspaper woman of ability, but she is best remembered in the Spokane county for her lovable character and sturdy bravery. She did newspaper work in practically all parts of the United States and proved herself a thorough "newspaper That is what she called her-

She never asked consideration be cause of her sex and always did a man's work at the desk or on the street. She was editor of four papers of her own at different times and worked under the direction of Governor Steunenberg during the critical period in the panhandle of Ida ho, and helped him in the fight, which ultimately resulted in his assassination. Wheat Amounts to 115,631,000 Bushels-Figures Showing the Great Productive Ability of Canadian Soil.

THRESHING RESULTS.

Ottawa, Oct. 12 .- A bulletin on the estimated yield and quality of field crops in Canada was given out by the census and statistics office Saturday. The returns are based upon actual threshing results, so far as these have been obtained. . The average yield of 1331 wheat is estimated at 174 bushels per acre, indicating a total production of 115,631,000 bushels; oats, 33.7 bushels per acre, total production 267,651,000 bushels; barley, 29.0 bushels per acra, total production 50,723,000 bushels and rye, 18.8 bushels per acre, total production 1,889,000 bushels.

The yield of peas is estimated at 7,178,000 bushels; beans, 1,182,000 bushels; buckwheat, 7,365,000 bushels; mixed grains, 19,113,000 bushels; flax seed 1,575,000 bushels; and corn, for husking, 21,007,000 bushels. Potatoes average 145.4 bushels per acre, with total production 73,228,000 bushels; turnips and other roots, 309.7 bushels per acre, total production, 84,075,000

Hay and clover are estimated at 1.4 tons per acre, the total yield being 11,642,000 tons, and fodder corn 10.9 tons per acre, total production 2,-835,000 tons.


